A descendant of the Takelma, Chinook, Molalla, and Santiam Kalapuyan peoples of western Oregon, Dr. David Lewis has devoted his career to making sure that Native histories are seen and remembered. As a professor in anthropology and Native studies at Oregon State University and a member of the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde, Dr. Lewis combines personal history, academic dedication, and a deep sense of purpose in his work. Through his teaching, writing, and public outreach, he helps expand awareness of Native cultures—especially the histories of the Kalapuyan peoples of western Oregon.
